
Year 2: Spring 1 Curriculum



English

In English, we will be reading The Tunnel which is written by our class author: Anthony Browne. The children will use their imaginations and descriptive language to write a setting description. Our class novel will be The Twits by Roald Dahl and the children will write some instructions for making a disgusting recipe for Mr and Mrs Twit! We will be using the writing features of exclamation marks, question marks, commas in lists and expanded noun phrases to describe. It is really important that with every piece of writing the children produce, their spelling, handwriting, sentence structure and overall content continues to gets better. Children have got to be able to say their sentences before writing them down as well as reading each sentence back once they have written completed one.

Handwriting in Year Two continues to focus on size and position of letters and numbers.

Maths

Maths lessons this half term will be very busy with children learning about:

- 2D and 3D shapes,
- money including working out change,

multiplication and division.
As well as working on these units, we will be spending lots of time improving our **fluency** (knowing the most efficient method to answer addition and subtraction questions quickly) and improving **recall and automaticity** (using known facts to answer maths problems). Numbersense ad Numbots really help with this.

Science

Year Two will become scientists when they learn all about: Everyday Materials. They will look at familiar objects and find out what they are made from and why. The children will also put their investigative skills to the test by designing an experiment which identifies the best material for an umbrella! The children will develop scientific skills such as using equipment, following instructions and grouping and sorting objects by similarity or

RE

In RE, Year Two will be continuing to answer the question: Who is a Muslim and what do they believe? The will learn about the Five Pillars of Islam, when and how Muslims pray and all about the Muslim holy book.

Topic (History)

This term we will be learning about the Great Fire of London. Children will compare London in 1666 with now, sequence the events of the great fire while examining historic resources such as the diary of Samuel Pepys.



Art Children will develop crafting skills with clay this half term when they use tools to create thumb pots, clay faces and tiles.

Computing

We will use the computer suite to create pictures using a paint programme. Children will select and use different brushes, colour, background and shapes. Online safety will focus on talking to adults if they feel uncomfortable about something online. Year Two will be exercising through dance and working on the skills of balancing and following instructions in a game. All children **must** have appropriate kit which they should wear for school on their PE day. PE kit consists of: black tracksuit/leggings/joggers/shorts, black hoodie or jumper for colder months, plain blue t-shirt, trainers (preferably waterproof ones that children can fasten. Football strips are **not** allowed. NB: At the moment, PE will be Wednesday mornings but this may change in the coming weeks so please keep a look our for further updates. Personal Development

This half term we will complete activities, games and have discussions around the themes of British Values, Raising Aspirations, Wellbeing, Mental Health and Keeping Safe. Year Two will focus on Democracy, Community, Goals, Balanced Lifestyle and Risks, Hazards and Danger.

Music

Music this half term will include learning songs to perform in February at Sunderland Music Hub's event called Infantasia. Our music curriculum will also include lessons on musical conversations with lots of call and response singing ad playing instruments. linked to our English text: The Tunnel.

Uniform and equipment Despite the cold weather, we try to get outside to play whatever the weather so it is really important that all children have a warm coat everyday. Please encourage your child to be able to fasten and unfasten their coat and shoelaces independently.

All cardigans and jumpers should be clearly named. Earrings and other items of jewellery should not be worn.

Ways to help your child.

Reading: Thank you for your support with this. For children reading our library books and accessing Accelerated Reader, they must continue to read with an adult and record their quiz scores in their reading record.

For children not yet accessing Accelerated Reader, new books will still be given out on Fridays. Thank you for your support with this - it has a huge impact on progress when children read regularly and frequently.

Spellings: Tests will be on a Friday new lists will be given out then too. Please make sure your child has their spelling log every Friday. There is no expectation for children to practise spelling a over a weekend or a holiday. What would really help your child is to **keep going back to Common Exception Words for Year 1 and 2 (**red tricky words). These can be found in reading records or online. Challenge your child to use those words in a written sentence.

Maths: Encourage your child to look for amounts and 2D and 3D shapes all around them, talk about the value of different coins, begin to tell the time, and practise counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.

Other homework: There may occasionally be homework such as consolidation of maths skills or a research project for topic or science. I will contact you via dojo when this is the case.
