English

In English our work will around the story "Jim and the Beanstalk" by Raymond Briggs. We will continue to develop and refine our descriptive writing and skills as well as develop our sentence structure using a varied sentence openers and interesting and rich vocabulary. We will also continue to improve our use of grammatical skills learned in the Autumn term, becoming more competent in the use of prepositions, adverbs and conjunctions. We will explore and practise genres including narrative, non-chronological reports and recounts. We will continue to have weekly focus spelling lessons which will build up to a spelling test each Friday.

During reading lessons the children will pay particular attention to developing their fluency, accuracy and automaticity in reading.

Key Year 3 Information

- It is important that all children continue to bring their reading books and reading logs to school each day and complete a quiz once they have completed their book. Please read at home with you child at least 3 times per week and sign their reading log. Encourage your child to talk about what they are reading and why they have/haven't enjoyed their book.
- Spellings will be sent home each Friday to be learned for a test the following Friday. Please sign spelling books to confirm your child has practised these.
- P.E. this half term will be on a **Wednesday** Children will need to bring a swimming kit to school.
- Please ensure your child's water bottle is cleaned and filled daily with fresh plain water.
- The children will be encouraged to develop their independence in dressing, undressing and taking
 care of their own personal belongings. They will also be encouraged to tie their own shoe laces. DOJO points will be awarded to those who learn and support their peers.

Our science topic is Animals including Humans. The children have already learned about healthy diets and nutrition and will relate to this as they begin to develop their knowledge of skeletons and muscles and how they work together.

Mathematics

In Maths we continue to follow the Whiterose maths curriculum and will be continuing to develop our knowledge and skills of multiplication and division including the introduction of formal written methods of these. We will employ knowledge of the 4 number operations, to carryout work relating to money, then move onto investigate and compare length and perimeters of objects. All children have their timestable rockstars log-ins printed in the front of their reading logs.

There is an expectation that your child will access this at home and complete the 15 minutes of tasks. This will support them in application of times table knowledge during maths lessons.

Accelerated Reader

The children are now more accomplished in using the accelerated reader programme. Focus will be to ensure children read carefully for meaning and are able to choose suitable books independently. They also need to develop the ability to read longer texts and build reading stamina. How frequently your child reads at home determines how frequently books are changed, however it is expected that parents/carers read at least 3 times per week with their child at home. Please encourage your child to talk about what they are reading.
